District-wide Emergency Response Plan

Building-level Emergency Response Plan

- Public Document
- Facilitates the coordination and continuity among schools in the district
- Ensures collaboration with local and county resources to plan, protect, respond, and recover in the event of violent incident and emergencies

- Confidential Document
- Provides building-specific information and direction
- Building-Level Emergency Response Team (BLERT)
- Explains how the school manages each function before, during and after an incident or emergency, including:
 - Evacuation
 - Shelter-in-place
 - Hold-in-place
 - Lockdown
 - Secure Lockout (New 2025)

The District Wide School Safety Team

- Appointed by the Board of Education
- The team includes, but is not be limited to:
 - BOE representatives
 - Teachers
 - Administrators
 - Parents
 - Students
 - Clerical
 - School monitors
 - Custodians
 - School Safety Personnel
 - Local Emergency Officials

District-Wide Emergency Response Plan Components (Excerpts)

Prevention

- Intervention strategies and dissemination of information regarding early detection of potentially violent behavior
- Annual school safety training for staff and students

Mitigation

- Identification of sites of potential emergencies
- Exercise and conduct drills to assess building-level preparedness
- Strategies for improving communication

Protection

- School building security
- Protocols to secure the buildings during incidents and emergencies

Response

- Contact with law enforcement and emergency officials
- Reunification and communication with families during an emergency

Recovery

- Debrief, documentation, and record-keeping
- Supporting affected members of the community

Prevention, Intervention, and Training

- Ongoing assessment of each school building
- Character Development and Training Programs
- Crisis Prevention Intervention Training (CPI)
- Threat Assessment Team
 - Training completed by Dr. Kostas Katsavdakis, Clinical and Forensic Psychologist and expert in Threat Assessment and Management
- Risk/Behavioral Assessment Training and Teams
- Anonymous Reporting System Sandy Hook Promise
- Digital and On-line Monitoring of School Network and Devices- GoGuardian
- Attendance at NYS School Safety Summit

Annual Training / Awareness for All Staff

Completed by September 15 of each year or within 30 days of employment

Amendments to Section 155.17, Regulations Related to School Safety Plan Requirements

Anticipated Adoption on July 31, 2024

Trauma-informed practices

Require that District-wide School Safety Plans ensure that:

- drills be conducted in a trauma-informed, developmentally and age-appropriate manner;
- drills must not include props, actors, or simulations intended to mimic a school shooting, incident of violence, or other emergency; and
- students and staff be informed when a school is conducting a drill.

Require that the District-wide School Safety Plan include:

- procedures for notifying parents or guardians of training and drills;
- policies and protocols for obtaining written consent for students to participate in full-scale exercises in conjunction with local and county emergency responders and officials on non-school days when school activities such as athletics are not occurring on school grounds;
- prevention and intervention strategies, including information on school or district-level behavioral assessment teams; and
- school monitors as members of the District-Wide School Safety Team

Response and Communication

- Respond to implied or direct threats immediately, including concerns of students who imply a threat against themselves (including self-harm)
- Guided by the District's Code of Conduct when any concern is brought to administrative attention
- Contact appropriate law enforcement officials in the event of a violent incident or threat
- Contact parents, guardians or persons in parental relation to students in the event of a violent incident or early dismissal
- Implement protocols in place for responding to a state disaster emergency, even those involving communicable disease

Emergency Supports and Resources

In the event of an emergency:

- Coordinate with emergency services and resources (i.e. 911)
 - Local law enforcement and fire department
 - Department of Homeland Security
 - Nassau County Emergency Management
 - Department of Mental Health
- Building-level Emergency Response Teams activate
- Utilize appropriate school personnel (i.e. School Nurse, Security)

Assess, Improve, and Document

- Conduct and assess preparedness through drills
 - 12 drills each school year (8 prior to December 1)
- Evaluate and improve communication with students, families, and staff
 - Multi-layered approach: Email, phone, walkie talkies, mobile wifi hotspots, etc.
- Ensure that every staff member in the school building is trained and has a role in an emergency
- Hire former law enforcement to serve as school security personnel

Proactive Building-level Measures

- Electronic, automatic classroom door locks
- Exterior doors remain locked at all times
- Visitors must:
 - enter through the main entrance
 - sign-in and wear visible identification
 - have limited access to areas of the building
- Security are stationed at the entrance of each school to ensure visitor management procedures are followed
- Security attend to building traffic flow
- Staff are required to wear visible identification badges



Timeline

July 8, 2024

Board of Education appoints a District-wide School Safety Team
The District-Wide Safety Plan is presented to the Board of Education for review and a
public hearing that provides for school staff, student, and public participation

The Safety Plan will be available for public comment 30 days prior to its
adoption to allow for input from the entire school community

August 26, 2024 The District-Wide School Safety Plan will be presented to the Board of Education for formal adoption (as required by September 1st of each year)

The District-Wide Safety Plan will be posted on the school district website and submitted to the NYSED and local law enforcement

August 27, 2024

^{*}The District-Wide Safety Plan is reviewed and updated on an annual basis.
