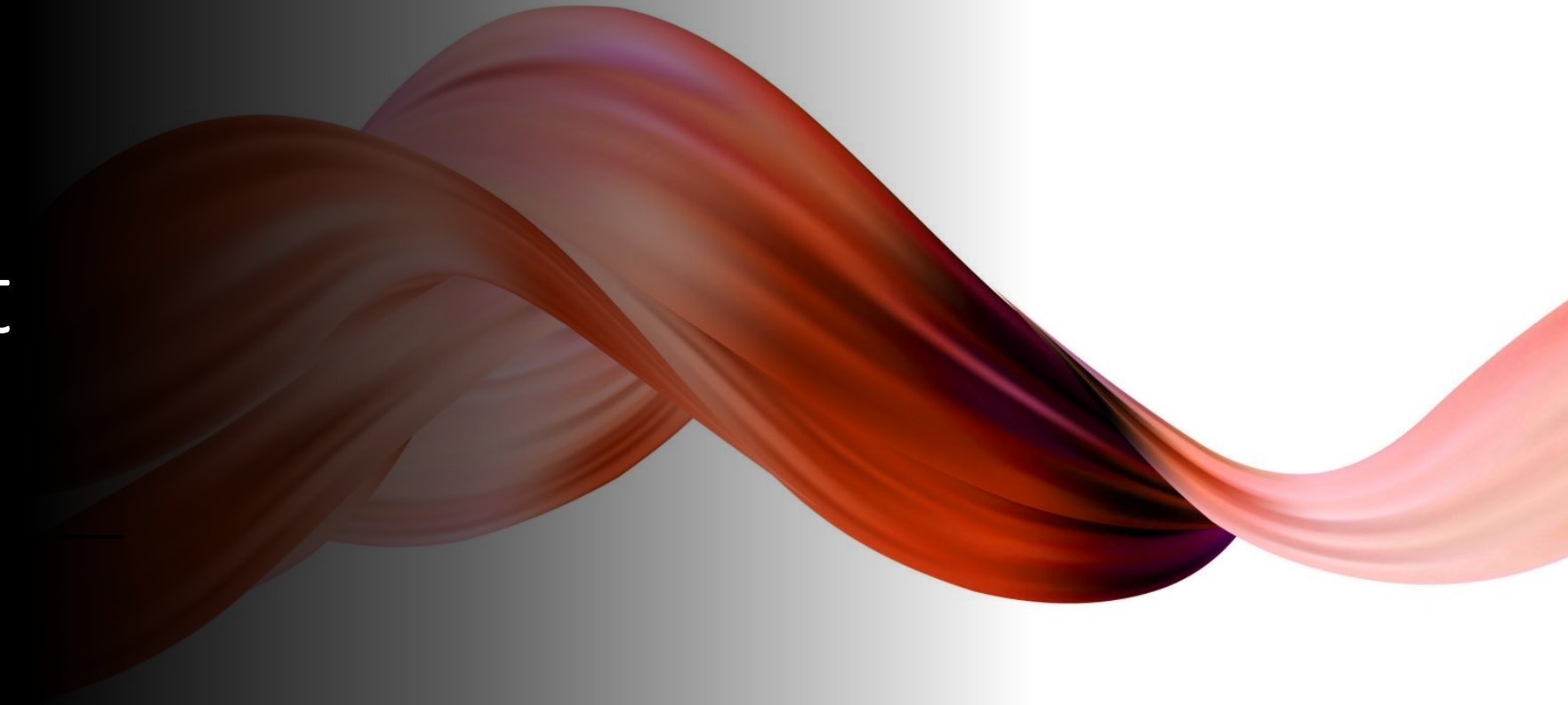

Evaluation Rubrics for Names (examples adapted from Weedsport)

Uses school colors ● Recognizable at different sizes ● Unique, distinctive and memorable ● Reflects community identity and positive values ● Relevant to the school and community ● Timeless and won't become outdated ● Simple, easily recognizable, even at small sizes ● Memorable and stands out among other logos ● Versatile with digital platforms, print materials, uniforms, and signage ● Safe if used as a costume.

BOE Facilities Priorities

- Address maintenance issues identified by our architects and engineers through the Annual Visual Inspection (AVI) and Building Condition Survey (BCS) process:
- Replace aging “portables” with permanent structures before they fail;
- Address sustained enrollment growth at the District.

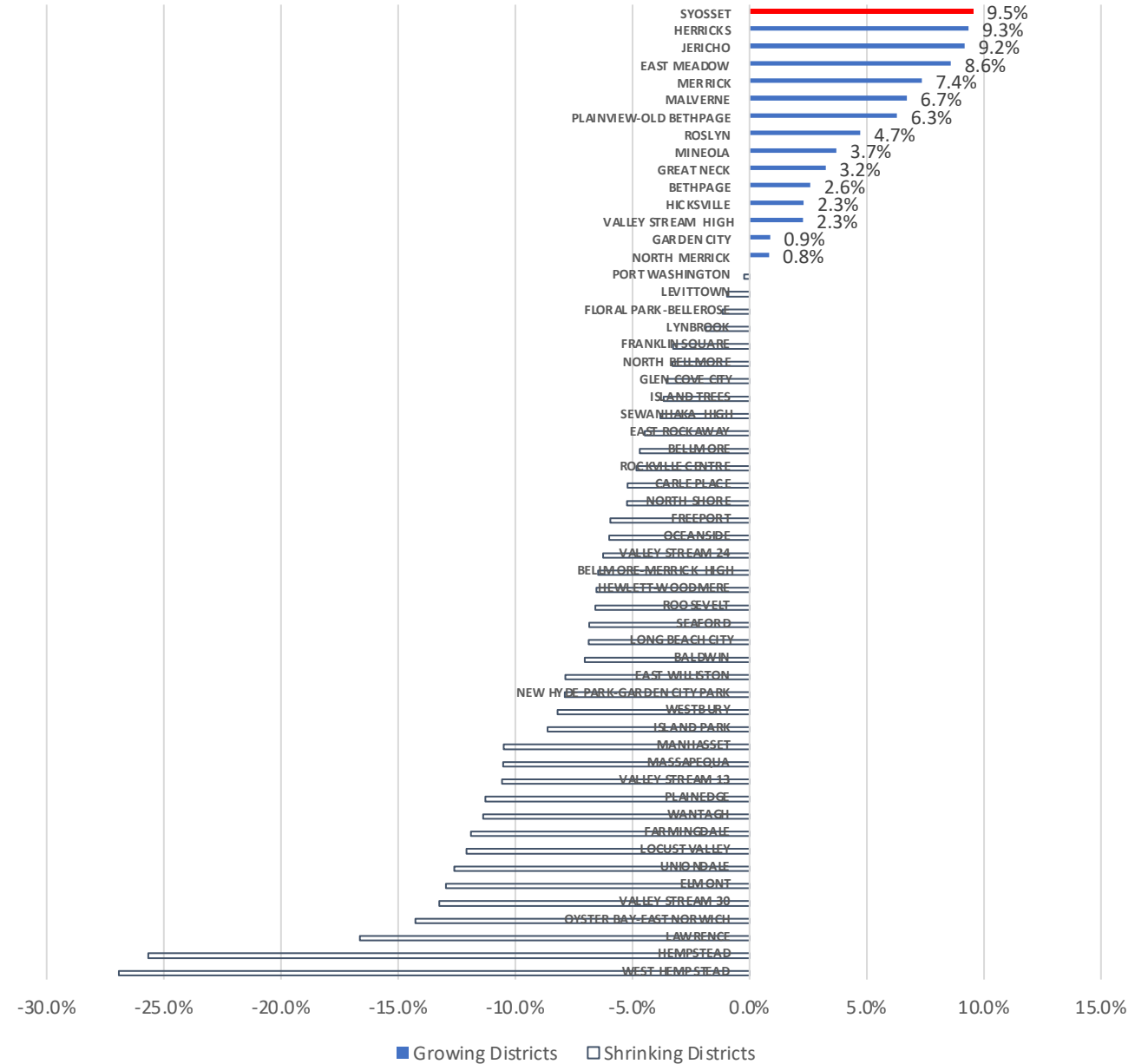

BOE Guidelines for Administration

- Address AVI/BCS concerns within the 5-year time horizon;
- Limit AVI/BCS work to the bare essentials;
- Identify buildings and systems past their useful life and in need of replacement (“portables”);
- Upgrade safety District-wide;
- Improve parity between buildings (i.e. HBT track);
- Accommodate enrollment growth;
- Remain within \$100 million for Proposition One.
